■ Former ConocoPhillips executive Larry
Archibald will join the board of Woodside
Petroleum in February as an independent, non-executive director.

Mr Archibald, whose career also included roles with BP and Amoco, has advised energy exploration and production companies since retiring from ConocoPhillips last year.
